

2012 SCHOOL SECURITY ORGANIZATIONAL CHART







2012 DOUGLASS CLUSTER MODEL




DOUGLASS HS - SY2011-12 VS. SY2012-13 (AUG-DEC)

TRIAD SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER MODEL






- Full-time employees

- Not all POLICE are SROs, but all SROs are POLICE




